Impact report on Cross-Cutting Issues

Keeping in mind the salient features of NEP 2020, which aims at providing multi-disciplinary education to students, ensuring their all-round development, the History department has revised its syllabi to encompass various crosscutting issues which sensitize the students about ethical aspects of human life.

The syllabus has been designed carefully to cover seven key issues of our times, which are: gender, environment & sustainability, human-values, professional-ethics, employability, entrepreneurship, skill-development.

While studying history, the students learn to analyze the evolution of human society through time.

They come to appreciate that, gender roles are different in different places, cultures, societies, and social classes. They also learn about the role women have played in historical development. This enables them to understand and respect the different gender groups.

Inculcating human values has always been a primary objective of history. Through the syllabi, the students learn about the various social reformers and their philosophies (from ancient reformers like Gautam Buddha to modern reformers like Swami Dayanand Saraswati), who helped in making the world a better place. The students learn to empathize and sympathize with various oppressed social groups. The syllabi also imbibe in them ethical values, through the study of various texts on ethics such as the Arthshastra, Mitakshara, Yajnavalakya Smriti, etc., which will help them in their professional lives.

The students also learn about environmental conservation and sustainable development techniques which have been part of Indian culture since the Harappan times. The students not only took part in the plantation drive organized by institute but have also formed groups to take and water the planted saplings.

The vocational courses have been designed keeping on mind the needs of the students to ensure employability through skill enhancement.

Department of Political Science & Public Administration

Impact of cross-cutting issues on students

The department of Political Science & Public Administration has carefully designed its syllabi in order to cover as many cross-cutting issues as possible and make sure that the same is practiced by students. Most of these cross-cutting issues impact the daily lives of our students and hence acquainting them of the same seems necessary.

Take for instance gender. Gender is not just read and taught in the classroom, but its reflection can be mapped in everyday interactions between students from different gender groups. The environment of the Institute and Department is maintained in such a manner that no discrimination based on sex is practiced and the same is carried forward in the classroom and in other spheres of the Institute. The Institute also has an ICC which tries to counsel and sensitize students and other IEHE members at regular intervals. All these combined make it a safe and equal space for all learning minds.

Similarly, if one talks of human values which are part of teaching and everyday manner of interaction has also ensured a healthy atmosphere in the Institute. Human values are taught through the life lessons of great Indian thinkers and the Indian Constitution and the same sense of generosity, empathy, nationalism and the like are depicted on occasion. Whether it is days celebrating Independence or Republic Day or blood donation drive or cleanliness drive, all depict the efforts taken to inculcate among students a need to practice and cherish human values.

The plantation drive in our Institute is also an important method to teach students about the environment and sustainability on an everyday basis. The changed pattern of gifting a pot with a plant to guests and dignitaries visiting the Department has been consciously undertaken to instil among students and other members of the IEHE community the need for a community goal of greener surroundings.

There are instances where professional ethics is explained through reviewing different positions and organizations prevalent within Indian administration and other services. Students from the Department have been selected for various fields ranging from bureaucracy to defence to academics. They have all practiced good conduct and continued ethical behaviour throughout their job.

In all, the students along with the faculty have imbibed these cross-cutting issues daily and have practiced them as and when the situation demands.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

The Department of Commerce has developed its syllabi covering many cross-cutting issues. The hidden objective is to make sure the same is practiced by students. Our students relate to these issues with their daily lives hence enabling them to sense the same.

छात्रों पर क्रॉस-कटिंग मुद्दों का प्रभाव (हिन्दी विशाग)

हिन्दी विभाग द्वारा क्रॉस-कटिंग मुद्दों को ध्यान रखकर सावधानीपूर्वक पाठयक्रम में इस प्रकार के विषयों को शामिल किया गया है जिनसे विद्यार्थियों को परिचित कराया जाना आवश्यक है।

क्रॉस कटिंग मुद्दों में शामिल बिन्दु मानवीय मूल्य, जिसके अंतर्गत भाईचारा, संवेदनशीलता, उदारता, राष्ट्रवाद, सहानुभूति आदि विषय आते हैं जिनका विकास आज के भौतिकवादी, उपभोगवादी और मशीनी युग में सभी मनुष्य में अति आवश्यक है। विभिन्न कहानियों जैसे शतरंज के खिलाड़ी, अपना-अपना भाग्य आदि, निबंध जैसे क्रोध आदि एवं हिन्दी साहित्य का इतिहास, कविताएं, नाटक आदि के माध्यम से विद्यार्थियों में उत्तम मानवीय संवेदनाएं व मूल्यों जैसे वृद्ध माता-पिता की भावनाओं का सम्मान(ताई कहानी में), अभाव, भूख, बेरोजगारी आदि से ग्रसित व्यक्तियों, बालकों की अनिवार्य सहायता(अपना-अपना भाग्य कहानी में), अपनी विलासिता आदि का त्याग कर राष्ट्र व समाज के प्रति अपने कर्तव्य को समझना(शतरंज के खिलाड़ी कहानी में), आदि का विकास किया जाता है।

विभिन्न अवसरों पर भारतीय साहित्यकारों जैसे कबीर, तुलसीदास, सूरदास, मीराबाई, मैथिलीशरण गुप्त, माखनलाल चतुर्वेदी, सूर्यकांत त्रिपाठी 'निराला', बाबा नागार्जुन, सिच्चिदानंद हीरानंद वात्स्यायन 'अज्ञेय' आदि व साहित्यकारों द्वारा अपनी रचनाओं में निर्मित उत्तम पात्रों जैसे - तुलसीदास द्वारा रचित 'रामचारित मानस' में राम, लक्ष्मण, सीता, हनुमान आदि अनेक पात्र, सुभद्रा कुमारी चौहान द्वारा रचित पात्र लक्ष्मीबाई, श्यामनारायण पाण्डेय द्वारा रचित हल्दीघाटी काव्य में महाराणा प्रताप का चरित्र, मुंशी प्रेम चंद द्वारा रचित गोदान मे गोबर, मालती, मेहता आदि के चरित्रों, संघर्षों, कर्तव्य पालन का स्मरण कर व संघर्षों, जीवन की महस्तुपूर्ण उपलब्धियों की चर्चाकर आदि द्वारा बच्चों के भीतर विभिन्न मानवीय मूल्यों का निर्माण व विकास किया जाता है।

'व्यक्तित्व विकास एवं प्रयोजन मूलक हिन्दी', 'सम्पादन प्रक्रिया और साजसज्जा' पाठयक्रम में स्किल डेवलेपमेंट एवं प्रोफेशनल इथिक्स जैसे मुददों से संबंधित विषयों को साथ जोड़कर छात्रों को इनके महत्व से परिचित कराया जाता है एवं रोजगार निर्माण में इसकी महती भूमिका से परिचित कराया जाता है। रोजगार कौशल को ध्यान में रखकर समाचार पत्र का सम्पादन प्रैक्टिकल में कराया जा रहा है। रोजगार में सहायक फिल्म मेकिंग, पटकथा लेखन, नाटक लेखन, कवितालेखन, कहानी लेखन, साक्षात्कार आदि जैसे रोजगार मूलक कौशल का विकास विद्यार्थियों में किया जाता है।

विभाग व कक्षा में छात्र एवं छात्राओं को समान अवसर प्रदान कर लिंग भेद जैसे किसी भी प्रकार से भेदभाव जैसा वातावरण नहीं उपस्थित होने दिया जाता। इसके साथ ही संस्थान में महिला प्रकोष्ठ का निर्माण लिंग भेदभाव से निजात पाने और छात्राओं को लिंग भेदभाव संबंधी शिकायतें करने और निराकरण के लिए निर्मित किया गया है।

पर्यावरण संबंधित मुद्दों की बात करें तो पर्यावरण के महत्व को दृष्टिगत रहते रखते हुए विभिन्न अवसरों पर वृक्षारोपण कर, स्वच्छता अभियान चला कर विद्यार्थियों को पर्यावरण एवं स्वच्छता के प्रति जागरुक किया जाता है। इसके अतिरिक्त पाठ्यक्रम में मिट्टी की महिमा, कामायनी(प्रसाद) आदि इस तरह की कविताएं सिम्मिलित हैं जो पर्यावरण संरक्षण और संवर्धन जैसे विषयों को प्रस्तुत करती हैं।

सारांश के कप में विद्यार्थी विभाग के साथ मिलकर क्रॉस-कटिंग मुद्दों को समझकर पाठ्यक्रम में न केवल पढ़ते हैं अपितु परिस्थिति के अनुकूल उसपर अध्यास करते रहते हैं और सामान्य जीवन में अपनाते हैं।

The class room teaching was made in the class of B.Sc. IIIst year on the topic of Environmental Studies. In this class room teaching discussion on waste water management and solid waste management. In next class student performed experiment (Recycling of Distillation Water). In the process of distillation vapors passing through the condenser tube are cooled and condensed by water flowing through condenser tube in the condenser unit of the apparatus. The water was cooled first by a simple indigenous cooling technique before it was allowed to enter again in condenser unit (recycling). Cooling technique involved collecting water from the outlet tube of the condenser unit in an earthen pot of about 50 litre capacity put on a cement container filled with wet sand or ice cubes. Once the water is filled in the earthen pot about ¾ of its capacity from the condenser unit it gets cooled. Then it is lifted to a reservoir tank of about 60 litre capacity placed at a height of 4 feet from the earthen pot, with the help of a small submersible motor placed in the earthen pot containing some ice cubes. This technique saves gallons of water of condenser cooling unit which otherwise go waste in the drain pipe.
